Tuesday is Pancake Day, and the celebration offers something for everyone. The traditional Pancake Day breakfast will be from 6 to 10 a.m. at the Seward County Event Center, with the breakfast program getting under way at 7:30 a.m.

A public reception will be at 9 a.m. at City Hall.

At 10 a.m., children's races begin, followed by the new youth division races, the Last Chance Race and the Men's Pacer Race.

The main event, the International Pancake Day Race, is at 11:55 a.m.

Immediately following the race, a shoving service is set for 12:15 p.m. at First Methodist Church. The Live Web Chat between Liberal and Olney, England, when the race winners from each city officially compare times, is set for 1:30 p.m., also at First Methodist. Finally, the day will end with the traditional parade at 3 p.m., running from 11th St. south down Kansas Avenue to Trail Street.#
