

This is the Pura Belpre Award book display Monday at Liberal's Memorial Library. This award started in 1996, and it is named after the first Latina librarian at the New York Public Library. The award is for children's books from Latina or Latino artists or Illustrators or writers, and it is presented annually. In the display, some of the books are in Spanish, some are in English, some are bilingual and the display is of three scenes from three different books.
