TYRONE — The Tyrone Bobcats dominated the overmatched Lobos from the opening tip, holding Yarbrough without a field goal until the final minute of the half on their way to a 71-19 romp.

" We needed this game to get some confidence back," said Bobcats coach Clay Witt. "It came at a good time, and it just feels good to get back in the win column."
