The Rockies and A's both had reasons to enter Wednesday's game with confidence. The Rockies had won two in a row, and the A's had just ended the league's longest winning streak in history by dominating the Royals 17-2 Saturday, ending a 14-game winning streak that dated back to 2011.

A fast start by the Rockies for the second time in less than a week led to the third straight victory for the Rockies with a 15-12 win over the A's.
