Angel Archuletta was able to toss five innings of no-hit baseball, and Timothy Fitzgerald came in relief for the final two innings to protect the lead.

Scott City committed six errors in the loss.

Stevie Lira went 2-4, and hit an RBI single in the first inning. Lorenzo Pando hit a two-RBI double in the first to start the scoring. Lorenza Avila went 2-3 with a double and scored a run.

“They turned it around and didn’t take another whipping,” Olmstead said.

Liberal will travel to Hugoton Friday and will return home for a three-game homestand Monday, Tuesday and Thursday next week.
