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In a mere 16 days the NFL will be kicking off the 2013 season when the Baltimore Ravens visit the Denver Broncos in a rematch of last years thrilling AFC divisional playoff game.

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With half of the remaining preseason games yet to be played, there are plenty of stories to follow as we head toward the regular season.

There has been a multitude of shake ups to multiple rosters in the league, which should make for a uniquely intriguing season.

How will the New England Patriots fare after having lost a good portion of their aerial attack? They still have Tom Brady and Bill Belichick running the show, but losing Wes Welker and Aaron Hernandez could doom the teams chances this season.
