

Ronny Gage was one of the original coaches of 'Angry Red,' and was an assistant on the 1972 state runner-up team.

"When Liberal decided to become a football power in the late 60's and early 70's, he was a good example of the type of coach that Noel Thomason brought to Liberal," Al Shank, a former player under Gage, said.

"Some of our coaches had great pedigrees," Shank said. "Ron and his Permian background, Troy Anderson who played at West Texas State with Mercury Morris, John Kendall who later would lead Liberal to a state championship as a head coach in his own right. Those were some of the assistants. The head coach was Noel Thomason from Pryor, Okla., who was nicknamed 'Gray Fox of the Osage.'"

"That was a pretty impressive group of men who were the heart and soul of the early 'Angry Red,'" Shank said. "A group I was honored to be a part of."
