The Beaver Lady Dusters had a happy homecoming thanks to a late third quarter rally that held up for a 41-36 win over the Boise City Lady Wildcats.



Beaver trailed 26-19 midway through the third quarter but finished the quarter with a furry, scoring 11 straight to go up 30-26 heading into the fourth. Beaver scored 8 of those points in just a 40 second stretch where their press turned turnovers into transition baskets.

Beaver did enough in the fourth for an 11-10 advantage to maintain for the win.
