Shattuck managed to get five runs across in the first inning.

Again Beaver started an inning well with Tomas Konkol hitting a leadoff double down the third base line. Konkol stole third and reached home when the throw to third ended up in left field to make the score 5-1.

Andrew Linville poked one into shallow left center, which moved Emory Tillman, who had walked, to third with only one out. Andrew Jesko then hit an RBI single to center to make the score 5-2 heading to the bottom of the second.

Shattuck scored seven runs before Beaver could collect an out, and finished the inning with 11 runs to go up 16-2.

The loss ended the Dusters season at 8-7.
