Any Jayhawk fan for the past 25 years will remember the 1988 season that ended with the national championship.

Earlier that year, the Jayhawks lost twice to the Sooners, the team they eventually defeated in the national championship game.

I couldn't help but think of that season when Liberal faced Haysville Tuesday in the NBC World Series in Wichita.
