Liberal man dies in 1-vehicle roll-over

A 48-year-old liberal man died in a one-vehicle roll-over crash on Thursday morning in the 1200 block of South 10th Street, according to police.

The crash occurred at approximately 7:30 a.m. on South 10th Street, just north of the intersection with 12th Street. The driver, identified as [Name], was traveling southbound on South 10th Street. The vehicle rolled over onto its side and came to a stop on the grassy area adjacent to the road.

Police officers arrived at the scene shortly after the crash. The driver was pronounced dead at the scene. The cause of the crash is still under investigation.

Small plane crash near Guyton kills 2
