Liberal man dies in 1-vehicle roll-over

Robert J. Williams, 57, of Guyton, died Tuesday afternoon after his 2007 Ford Focus rolled over on its side on Highway 101 near the intersection of Highway 101 and Highway 102. Williams was driving alone at the time of the crash. The vehicle rolled over twice before coming to a stop. Williams was pronounced dead at the scene. The cause of the crash is still under investigation.

Small plane crash near Guyton kills 2

A small Cessna 441 twin-engine propeller airplane crashed into a field near Guyton, killing the pilot and a passenger. The crash occurred on Tuesday afternoon. The plane was on a flight from Guyton to a nearby town. The crash site is located about 10 miles from Guyton. The cause of the crash is still under investigation.
