A single vehicle roll-over on Interstate 490 in Guyton, Mo., on Wednesday killed a 46-year-old man and injured a 17-year-old girl. The driver, James R. Smith, of Guyton, Mo., was pronounced dead at the scene. The girl, who was in the back seat, was taken to a hospital and is in stable condition. The crash occurred at approximately 10:30 p.m. on I-490 near Exit 145. The cause of the crash is still under investigation.

**NASA astronaut presents lecture**  
Audience fishes view experiences from outer space

A group of about 100 people gathered in the auditorium of the Guyton Public Library on Wednesday evening to hear a lecture by NASA astronaut Gregory B. Bressani. Bressani, who has spent time in space on the Space Shuttle Columbia and the International Space Station, shared his experiences and insights into life in space. He discussed the challenges of living and working in a confined environment, the importance of teamwork, and the scientific experiments conducted during his missions. Bressani also talked about his upcoming mission to the International Space Station in 2013. The lecture was part of a series of events celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 moon landing.
