MCADD a silent killer for many

A 14-year-old boy, who looks like the healthy, smiling baby he is, has a secret. His parents, Colleen and Morgan, know that only hours after his birth, he was a typical orange from death.

Colleen and Morgan know that their son, Logan, was born with a rare genetic condition called MCADD (medium-chain acyl-CoA dehydrogenase deficiency). It is a rare, inherited metabolic disorder that can be fatal if not diagnosed and treated early.

Logan's parents, Colleen and Morgan, were told that their son had MCADD when he was just a few days old. They were given a list of symptoms to watch for, but they didn't know what to do. Logan was healthy and happy, and they thought they were doing everything right.

But then, one day, Logan was sick. He was vomiting and had a fever. His parents took him to the doctor, but the doctor didn't know what was wrong. They took him to the hospital, but the doctors there also didn't know what was wrong.
