Kansas man convicted of kicking girlfriend to death

WICHITA, Kan. — A Kansas man who kicked his girlfriend to death has been sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole.

The 37-year-old man, identified as [Name], was found guilty of first-degree murder after a trial that lasted several weeks. The victim, [Name], was 32 years old at the time of the crime.
