Liberal man faces 32 months in prison
A federal judge has sentenced a 32-year-old man to 32 months in prison for his role in a conspiracy to defraud a bank. The man, who is a former member of the Liberal Party, was found guilty of conspiring to defraud a bank of \$1.5 million. The judge sentenced him to 32 months in prison, with 12 months to be served in a federal prison. The man is currently being held in a federal detention center in New York City.
