Fort Hood shooter convicted on 13 counts of murder
 A federal jury in Fort Hood, Texas, has convicted a man charged with the 2009 shooting on 13 counts of murder. The defendant, a former U.S. Army soldier, was found guilty of the deaths of 13 people and the attempted murder of another. The trial was held in a courtroom in Fort Hood, and the verdict was announced on August 23, 2013.

US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, Haskell counties starts
 The Bureau of Transportation Planning and Construction has announced that the US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, and Haskell counties has officially started. The project involves the construction of a new bypass for US-56, which will improve traffic flow and safety in the region. Construction is expected to begin in the fall and continue through 2015.

Random attack in Spokane leaves WWII veteran dead
 A random attack in Spokane, Washington, has resulted in the death of a World War II veteran. The victim, an elderly man, was struck by a vehicle while walking on a sidewalk. The driver of the vehicle fled the scene, and the police are currently investigating the incident. The victim's death is being treated as a homicide.
