FORT HOOD, Texas (AP) — A man accused of the 2009 mass shooting at Fort Hood, Texas, has been convicted on 13 counts of murder. The man, Nidal Hasan, was found guilty of 13 counts of murder and 13 counts of attempted murder. He was sentenced to life in prison. The shooting at Fort Hood in 2009 resulted in the deaths of 13 people and the injury of more than 30 others. Hasan was the only person charged in the shooting.
