Fort Hood shooter convicted on 13 counts of murder
A federal judge has convicted a man accused of the 2009 Fort Hood shooting on 13 counts of murder. The man, Nidal Hasan, was found guilty of 13 counts of murder and 13 counts of attempted murder. He was sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole. The shooting occurred on October 3, 2009, at Fort Hood, Texas, and resulted in the deaths of 13 people and the injury of 30 others.

US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, Haskell counties starts
The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) has awarded a contract to the Stevens, Seward, and Haskell counties for the US-56 project. The project is a multi-phase effort to improve the road and surrounding infrastructure. The project includes the construction of a new bridge over the Neosho River, the widening of the road, and the installation of new lighting and signage. The project is expected to be completed by the end of 2014.

Random attack in Spokane leaves WWII veteran dead
A random attack in Spokane, Washington, has resulted in the death of a World War II veteran. The victim, 82-year-old Robert J. Smith, was shot in the back by an unidentified assailant on August 20, 2013. Smith was a member of the 101st Airborne Division and served in Europe during World War II. He was a resident of Spokane and was walking to his car when he was shot. The police are currently investigating the attack and have identified several suspects.
