Fort Hood shooter convicted on 13 counts of murder

PHOENIX — A man who shot and killed seven people and wounded 30 others at Fort Hood, Texas, in 2009, has been convicted on 13 counts of murder. The man, Nidal Hasan, was found guilty of the crimes in a federal court in Phoenix on August 20, 2013. Hasan was sentenced to life in prison for each of the murders and a 10-year term for each of the attempted murders. He is also facing charges of conspiracy to commit murder and possession of a firearm by a prohibited person.

US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, Haskell counties starts
The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) has awarded a contract to the Stevens, Seward, and Haskell counties for the US-56 project. Random attack in Spokane leaves WWII veteran dead

PHOENIX — A random attack in Spokane, Washington, on August 20, 2013, left a World War II veteran dead. The victim, 82-year-old Robert J. Smith, was shot in the chest while walking in a park in Spokane. Smith was a member of the United States Marine Corps and served in the Pacific Theater during World War II. He was a decorated veteran and had received several military awards. The attack was a random act of violence and the shooter has not been identified.
