Fort Hood shooter convicted on 13 counts of murder
A federal judge has convicted a man accused of the 2009 Fort Hood shooting on 13 counts of murder. The man, Nidal Hasan, was found guilty of the deaths of 13 people and the attempted murder of 30 others. The conviction is the result of a trial that lasted several weeks. Hasan's lawyer has filed an appeal of the conviction.

US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, Haskell counties starts
The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) has announced that the US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, and Haskell counties has started. The project is a multi-phase effort to improve the road and surrounding infrastructure. The first phase involves widening the road and adding shoulders. The second phase involves improving drainage and lighting. The third phase involves adding sidewalks and bike lanes. The project is expected to be completed by 2015.

Random attack in Spokane leaves WWII veteran dead
A random attack in Spokane, Washington, has resulted in the death of a World War II veteran. The victim, 82-year-old Robert J. Smith, was shot in the back by an unidentified assailant.
