American Legion suspects it was targeted by IRS

The American Legion in Lawrence, Kan., is suspecting it was targeted by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) after receiving a letter from the agency. The letter, dated Aug. 22, stated that the Legion was in violation of the IRS's rules regarding the use of funds. The Legion's executive director, John Smith, said the letter was "very confusing" and that the Legion was not sure what it was supposed to do. He said the Legion was a 501(c)(3) organization and that it was not supposed to be involved in politics. The Legion is currently reviewing the letter and may seek legal advice.

Kansas law enforcement cracking down through Labor Day

Law enforcement agencies across Kansas are cracking down on drunk driving through Labor Day. The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is running a "Sober Up" campaign to reduce the number of drunk driving accidents. The campaign includes increased patrols, sobriety checkpoints, and public service announcements. KDOT is also providing information on the dangers of drunk driving and the consequences of a DUI. The campaign will continue through Labor Day, Sept. 2.

NSA admits rare willful surveillance violations

The National Security Agency (NSA) has admitted to rare willful surveillance violations. The agency's Inspector General, John P. White, said the violations occurred in 2011 and 2012. The violations involved the collection of information on U.S. citizens without proper authorization. The agency has taken steps to prevent such violations from occurring in the future. The violations were the result of a "willful" disregard of the agency's policies and procedures. The agency is currently reviewing the violations and may take disciplinary action against the individuals involved.
