American Legion suspects it was targeted by IRS
The American Legion in Lawrence, Kan., is suspecting it was targeted by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) after receiving a letter from the agency. The letter, dated Aug. 21, 2013, stated that the IRS had received information that the Legion was a tax-exempt organization. The Legion's attorney, David L. Smith, said the letter was "very confusing" and that the Legion was not a tax-exempt organization. Smith said the Legion was a 501(c)(3) organization and that it had never been recognized as such by the IRS. The Legion is currently in the process of applying for recognition as a 501(c)(3) organization.

Kansas law enforcement cracking down through Labor Day
Law enforcement agencies across Kansas are cracking down on drunk driving through Labor Day. The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is running a "Sober Up" campaign to encourage drivers to drink responsibly and not drink and drive.
