SUICIDE WATCH
A new study published in the journal *Journal of Clinical Psychiatry* suggests that people who are suicidal are more likely to be helped by a mental health professional than by a family member or friend. The study, which involved 100 people who had attempted suicide, found that 60 percent of those who were helped by a professional went on to commit suicide, compared to 80 percent of those who were helped by a family member or friend. However, the study also found that people who were helped by a professional were more likely to seek help again in the future, suggesting that professional help may be more effective in the long run. **USA MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID** • See 130079p.16
