**POWER GRAB IN THE SENATE**  
Senate Democrats rewrite rules, erasing 255 years of filibuster rights of the minority

WASHINGTON — Senate Democrats on Thursday passed a sweeping new set of rules that would strip the Senate of its filibuster, a move that would allow the majority to pass legislation with a simple majority vote. The move is seen as a major power grab by the Democrats, who are in the minority in the Senate. The new rules would also change the way the Senate handles nominations and confirmations.
