Ammy makes staff changes after email about women

DENVER — Ammy, the local food and beverage company, has announced a series of staff changes following a controversial email sent to employees. The email, which was leaked to the press, contained a list of names and was interpreted as a list of women who were being targeted for termination. Ammy CEO, David Ammy, has since issued a public statement denying the allegations and announcing that the company will be restructuring its workforce. The changes include the departure of several key employees, including the company's vice president of operations. Ammy has also announced that it will be implementing a new policy regarding the treatment of women in the workplace.

Philly officer delivers baby in back seat of taxi
PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A woman gave birth to a baby in the back seat of a taxi cab in Philadelphia on Saturday. The woman, who was in labor, called 911 and was taken to a nearby hospital. The taxi driver, who was a police officer, was instructed to take the woman to the hospital. The baby was born safely and is now in good health. The woman is also recovering well from the birth. The incident is being investigated by the Philadelphia Police Department.

Many exchange health plans exclude top hospitals

DENVER — Many health insurance exchange plans are excluding top hospitals from their networks, a new study has found. The study, conducted by the Kaiser Family Foundation, found that 15% of the exchange plans surveyed excluded at least one of the top 10 hospitals in the country. The study also found that the majority of the excluded hospitals were in the top 10 states for the number of exchange plans. The study suggests that the exclusion of top hospitals from exchange plans could limit the choices of consumers and potentially increase costs. The Kaiser Family Foundation is a non-partisan research organization that provides information on health care issues.
