DOJ enters 'knockout game' fray with hate crime charge

The Justice Department has filed a hate crime charge against a man accused of a violent assault on a gay man in a Washington, D.C., bar.

The DOJ is the first to file a hate crime charge in this case, which is also being investigated by the FBI.
