Home electricity use in US falling to 2001 levels



Home electricity use in the United States has fallen to levels not seen since 2001, according to a report from the U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA). The report shows that residential electricity consumption in the U.S. fell by 1.5 percent in 2012, marking the first decline since 2009.

The EIA attributes the decline to a combination of factors, including a shift in the mix of electricity generation, improvements in energy efficiency, and a decline in the number of new homes being built.
