

The Benghazi Transcripts: Top Defense officials briefed Obama on 'attack,' not video or protest

WASHINGTON — A senior defense official says that top defense officials briefed President Obama on the Sept. 11, 2012, attack on the U.S. consulate in Benghazi, Libya, as an "attack" rather than a protest or video release, according to a transcript of the meeting. The transcript, obtained by The Associated Press, shows that the top defense officials, including then-Defense Secretary Leon Panetta and then-Defense Secretary Robert M. Gates, briefed Obama on the attack on Sept. 11, 2012. The transcript also shows that the top defense officials discussed the possibility of a terrorist attack on the consulate. The transcript is part of a larger transcript of the meeting, which is being released by the House Armed Services Committee.
