Survey says: 'Scale back'
Vision Team tightens scope, price tag of bond issue

A survey of voters in the Lehigh Valley area shows that a majority of respondents support a bond issue to fund a new regional arena, but only if the project is scaled back and the price tag is reduced. The survey, conducted by the Lehigh Valley Economic Development Authority, found that 65 percent of voters support the bond issue, down from 75 percent in a previous survey. However, 80 percent of voters support the bond issue if the arena is scaled back to 100,000 seats and the price tag is reduced to \$100 million. The survey also found that 75 percent of voters support the bond issue if the arena is scaled back to 50,000 seats and the price tag is reduced to \$50 million.
