**The Benghazi Transcripts: Top Defense officials briefed Obama on 'attack,' not video or protest**

**WASHINGTON** — A top defense official told President Obama that the Sept. 11, 2012, attack on the U.S. consulate in Benghazi, Libya, was a terrorist attack, not a protest or video release, according to a transcript of a meeting between the president and his top military and intelligence officials. The transcript, obtained by The Associated Press, shows that the defense secretary, then Gen. Martin Dempsey, informed Obama that the attack was a "terrorist attack" and that the U.S. military was not involved in the response.
