**The Benghazi Transcripts: Top Defense officials briefed Obama on 'attack,' not video or protest**

WASHINGTON — A top defense official told a Senate subcommittee that he had briefed President Obama on the attack in Benghazi, Libya, on Sept. 11, 2012, but that he did not mention the word "attack" or show any video or protest footage. The official, who spoke on the condition of anonymity, said that he had been told by a senior defense official that the attack was a "terrorist attack" and that he had passed this information on to the president.

Sen. John Cornyn, R-Texas, said that he was "concerned" that the defense officials had not been fully forthcoming in their briefing of the president. He said that he had reviewed the transcripts of the briefing and that he had found several instances where the officials had been evasive or had omitted key information.

The subcommittee is conducting an investigation into the Benghazi attack, which resulted in the deaths of four U.S. citizens, including Ambassador Christopher Stevens. The attack has raised questions about the readiness of the U.S. military and the intelligence community to respond to such threats.

The transcript shows that the defense officials were aware of the attack and that they had been discussing the possibility of a "terrorist attack" in the days leading up to the event. However, they did not mention the word "attack" or show any video or protest footage to the president.

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
