Incumbent Linenbroker is running for re-election to the county commission. He has a strong record of service and is seeking another term.

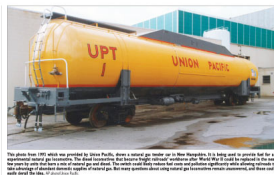
Education efforts expand to election
