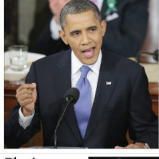

### Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

President Barack Obama is expected to announce a new "practical" agenda focusing on immigration, income equality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The agenda is expected to be unveiled in the coming weeks, and will focus on issues that are seen as key to the president's re-election campaign.

The agenda is expected to include proposals for immigration reform, including a path to citizenship for undocumented immigrants.
