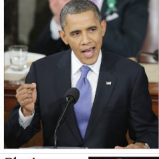

Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

President Barack Obama is expected to announce a new "practical" agenda focusing on immigration, income equality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The agenda is expected to be unveiled in the coming weeks, and will focus on issues that are seen as key to the president's re-election campaign.

The agenda is expected to include proposals for immigration reform, including a path to citizenship for undocumented immigrants. It will also focus on income equality, including proposals for raising the minimum wage and strengthening labor protections.

Other issues that are expected to be part of the agenda include education reform, infrastructure investment, and energy policy. The agenda is expected to be a key part of Obama's re-election strategy, and will be used to appeal to voters who are concerned about the economy and social issues.
