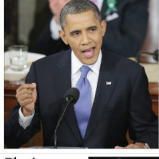

Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

President Barack Obama is expected to announce a new set of policies aimed at addressing immigration and income inequality, according to a senior administration official. The president is expected to unveil a "practical" agenda that focuses on these two issues, which are seen as key priorities for his second term. The official said that the president's plan will include measures to attract more immigrants to the U.S. economy and to provide a path to citizenship for those who are currently in the country illegally. On the income inequality front, the president is expected to announce a series of tax and regulatory reforms aimed at reducing the gap between the rich and the rest of the population.
