## Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

President Barack Obama is expected to announce a "practical" agenda focusing on immigration, income equality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The official said the president will likely announce the agenda in the next few weeks. The agenda is expected to include measures to address the needs of immigrants, particularly those who are undocumented, and to improve the lives of low-income Americans. Obama is also expected to announce a plan to reform the federal budget and to address the nation's long-term fiscal challenges.
