A review of newly obtained emails suggests a White House aide was involved in preparing Secretary of State Hillary Clinton for a video explanation of the 2012 Benghazi attack. The emails, which were obtained through a Freedom of Information Act request, show a close relationship between the aide and Clinton's staff in the days leading up to the attack. The aide is seen discussing the attack and the need for a video explanation, as well as coordinating with Clinton's staff to prepare for the video.
