City's newly renovated shooting range to open Saturday
The City of Liberal announced the opening of its newly renovated shooting range on Saturday, June 7. The range, located at 12th and Main, has been completely rebuilt and now features modern equipment and facilities. The renovation project was a major undertaking for the city, involving the demolition of the old range and the construction of a new, larger facility. The new range will provide a safe and enjoyable environment for residents and visitors alike. The city officials expressed their pride in the new range and their commitment to providing quality recreational opportunities for the community.

Frequently asked questions about the shooting range
Q: How long will the range be open?
A: The range will be open from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, seven days a week, starting on Saturday, June 7, and continuing through the end of the summer season. Hours may vary during the winter months.
Q: Are there any fees to use the range?
