City to discuss development financing plan

The City of Liberal is considering a plan to raise money for the city's infrastructure needs through a series of bonds. The plan would allow the city to issue up to \$10 million in bonds over the next five years. The bonds would be used to pay for a variety of projects, including the construction of a new city building, the renovation of the city's water treatment plant, and the improvement of the city's streets and sidewalks.
